

Privacy Statement

Introduction

The Central Florida Crime Prevention Association (CFCPA) has a strong commitment to providing excellent service to all of its website visitors, including respecting their concerns about privacy. Browsing

Data Collection

For example, if you would like additional information, we will ask you for information such as name, address, telephone number and email address to process your request.

Cookies

“Cookies” are strings of text that a website transmits to a user’s computer. Our website does not use “cookie” technology.

CFCPA’s Use of Information

We treat the information you provide to us as confidential information; it is, accordingly, subject to our security

procedures and strict policies regarding protection and use of confidential information.

Dispute Resolution
